NPFMC Revisits the Salmon FMP

The Magnuson-Stevens Act (MSA) gives the North Pacific Fishery Management Council (Council) responsibility for all fisheries in federal waters (EEZ), which

extend offshore from 3 to 200 miles. From 1977-78 a fishery management plan (FMP) was developed for

salmon, which was adopted by the Council in December 1978 and approved by the Secretary of Commerce in May 1979. The plan has been amended nine times. In 1990, the Council deferred management authority to the State of Alaska, so long as it complies with the MSA, Pacific Salmon Treaty, and the

National Standard One

Conservation and management measures shall prevent overfishing

while achieving, on a continuing basis, the optimum yield from each fishery for the United States fishing industry.

Endangered Species Act (ESA). Recent amendments to the MSA have created a situation whereby the Council may have to take action on the Salmon FMP to make it consistent with MSA National Standard One.

When designing the FMP, the Council designated two federal salmon fishing areas: West of Cape Suckling, where sport and limited commercial net fishing occurs in the EEZ in the False Pass, Cook Inlet, and Copper River districts; and, East of Cape Suckling, which involves troll and sport fisheries. In most cases, the Council concentrated on developing regulations for salmon fisheries that mirrored state law. Through the FMP, the Council prohibited the foreign taking of salmon and also trolling West of Cape Suckling. It implemented harvest ranges and reporting requirements; set a 28" size limit for Chinook; put restrictions on gear; and, established state and federal permit requirements - including a moratorium on the size of the troll fleet. It also designated essential fish habitat. Since deferring Salmon FMP management to the state, the Council has had to do little beyond review and approve the troll fleet's incidental take permit under the ESA.

New MSA requirements call for annual catch limits and accountability standards to avoid overfishing. While such tools are appropriate for groundfish stocks, they are not a good fit for the unique biology of salmon. The Council and State recognize this fact. However, the Council has been tasked with updating all fishery management plans to comply with new MSA rules, so the issue was discussed during the December Council meeting. ATA provided initial testimony. The Council identified the following alternatives, which will be developed into a document for public review and comment in 2011:

Alternative 1: No action - no changes to the FMP.

Alternative 2: Maintain the existing geographic scope of the FMP and update.

Alternative 3: Modify FMP to exclude the three historic commercial salmon net fishing areas in the Western portion of the EEZ and update.

Alternative 4: Maintain the FMP in the Eastern EEZ only and update.

Under Alternatives 2-4: In areas where the Salmon FMP applies, management under any alternative would be deferred to the State of Alaska.



ATA Fall Board of Directors Meeting Report

The Board met in Juneau November 4-7 and discussed many issues: chinook quota and mitigation program; new USCG safety legislation; ongoing lack of ice capacity in key areas; enforcement; Mitchell Act hatchery funding; Magnuson-Stevens Act; offshore aquaculture; genetically engineered salmon; NOAA weather; Tongass land trades; and, stream rehabilitation. We met with treaty reps and ADFG Deputy Commissioner/Treaty Commissioner David Bedford on treaty and NPFMC related topics. Primary meeting focus was 2012 Board of Fisheries proposal development and preparing for the second round of treaty Chinook mitigation. Follow up on both issues will occur at the spring ATA board meeting in Juneau.

Board of Fisheries: Proposal Deadline April 9, 2010

2011 Kodiak

Proposal 69 seeks to allow set net fishermen in Kodiak to convert their permits to troll gear for a portion of the year. ATA opposes the proposal, which will be taken up at the January 11-14, 2011 meeting.

2012 Southeast/Yakutat Finfish

DRAFT Board of Fisheries Proposals The ATA Board encourages your feedback and ideas.

- 1. Open coho fishery June 1
- 2. Open corridor near Neets Bay for retention of coho through Sept. 30.
- 3. Open an area near Mist Cove for retention of coho during August closure.
- 4. Revise the lingcod management plan.

Treaty Chinook Salmon Mitigation

Board was briefed on the status of a two year, \$15 million Chinook mitigation program. The state approved \$7.5 million in projects and direct payments. The program is getting underway now. Money for 2011 is in President Obama's budget, pending approval by Congress.

Trawl Salmon Bycatch Reduction Plan Takes Shape

Last year the Council developed a plan to reduce trawl salmon bycatch in the Bering Sea; focus has now turned to the Gulf of Alaska (GOA). Trawlers in the GOA landed over 50,000 Chinook during the 2009-10 season -- a 594% increase from the previous year. Many things can account for sharp rises in bycatch levels, but the Council and trawl industry are searching for options to avoid a repeat. NMFS recently re-initiated ESA consultation on the fishery, because trawlers were over the permitted bycatch level. This adds incentive to find a fix. Among other ideas, the trawlers discussed use of a voluntary co-op program to help their fleet avoid salmon.

ATA testified, calling for both emergency regulations for 2011 and a long term plan including: full retention; modifications to the observer program; better enumeration of bycatch numbers by various trawl fisheries; identification and management of any 'hot spot' areas where salmon are caught by trawlers in both federal and state waters; and, better methodology to define stock composition.

The Council wheels move slow, partly due to it public process requirements. Emergency rules may not be in place by the spring fishery, but alternatives were approved for review and include many of ATA's requests. The pollock fishery will be the initial focus, because it's thought the biggest reductions in bycatch can be achieved through that fleet. The Council will also work on a comprehensive bycatch plan for the GOA.
